

In Calendar year 2019, the Town of Dayton spent over \$6,000 video inspecting 7000' of sanitary sewer mains to determine the cause of increased flow during rainfall events. No defects in piping or connections were discovered. Recent heavy rainfall in early 2020 has again resulted in significant increased flow in the sanitary sewer lines of Dayton. These flows have resulted in increased cost to the town because of the per gallon fee we are charged. A suspected contributor to the high flow is the illegal connection of sump pumps and/or downspouts to the sanitary sewer lines of homes and businesses. These illegal connections result in higher cost for the town and conversely, for its residents.

Please do your part in helping keep cost down by removing all sump pump and downspout connections from the sanitary sewer system. Contact Town Hall at 765-296-2533 to determine where the nearest storm water outlet is in your neighborhood. The Town of Dayton will make every reasonable effort to provide an outlet or connection point.

#### §53.06 PROHIBITION ON DISCHARGE

- (A) No Person shall discharge or cause to be discharged any stormwater, surface water, groundwater, roof runoff, subsurface drainage, uncontaminated cooling water or unpolluted industrial process waters to any sanitary sewer.
