

Public Notice from Dayton's Public Water Provider

On April 9th, 2025 the Town of Dayton was contacted by the Lafayette Water Works, Dayton's public water provider, stating that on March 31st E. coli was detected in a sample from Lafayette's well #14. Immediately upon learning of the result, well #14 was shut down and isolated from the system. Within 24 hours of learning of the deficiency, Lafayette re-tested five samples from the well. All five samples were found Absent of any deficiencies. A copy of Lafayette's Public Notice as well as the results of their five tests can be found by clicking [HERE](#). Because of the five resulting tests being found Absent of any deficiencies, it is speculated that the original test may have been compromised at collection or mishandled by the lab performing the testing. As further assurance of the safety of Dayton's drinking water, Dayton regularly scheduled test on April 7th, 2025 (7 days after Lafayette's detection) was performed and its results were Absent of any deficiencies.
